armonie invisibili: design as a threshold between matter and intuition

In the beating heart of Milan Design Week 2025, **5VIE** presents "**armonie invisibili**", an immersive journey exploring those subtle forces that link the visible and the invisible, form and meaning, object and intuition. While beauty is often reduced to aesthetics or consumption, this exhibition explores design as a **language of resonance**, an echo of hidden balances that shape the way we inhabit the world. Each work on display is more than an object: it is a **knot in a web of secret connections**, a living architecture of relationships that transcend the tangible.

Harmony is the ability to **compose and tune**, to create a **consonance of voices and forms**, to balance materials, volumes and proportions, just as in music simultaneous sounds are combined to create an experience that resonates in the soul. The philosophers of ancient Greece recognised harmony as an essential principle of the world: **Heraclitus**, in the 6th century B.C., described it as the result of the meeting of opposites, affirming that "what contrasts coincides, and from elements in discord the most beautiful harmony is created". Harmony, then, is not mere symmetry, but the result of a dynamic balance between opposing forces, just as it is in design, where the dialogue between matter and space, fullness and emptiness, structure and fluidity creates unique experiences.

But the most authentic harmony is often *invisible*, not immediately perceptible to the eye, but only perceived through an understanding of the deep relationships between the elements. Plato, in the *Phaedrus*, emphasised that harmony is an intelligible principle, a force that binds parts together according to mathematical and proportional relationships, a concept echoed in the thought of the Pythagoreans and taken up by architecture and design in later centuries.

This principle manifests itself with the same force in contemporary design: every form, whether related to the material or its texture, responds to a hidden harmony that determines its emotional and perceptual impact. **Just as in the lyre of Philolaus**, where the strings are tuned according to precise mathematical proportions, in design each element is interrelated, creating a subtle balance that can be felt even before it is rationally understood.



But this harmony doesn't just belong to artists and designers: it is a universal key that runs through everyone's life and influences every daily gesture, from the choice of an object to the architecture of the environments we inhabit.

For those who work in the field of **collectable design**, understanding and shaping these harmonies means crossing the boundary between object and symbol, between function and poetry, creating pieces that are not just furnishing elements but true sensory and conceptual experiences.

"armonie invisibili" invites us to rediscover design as **a bridge between worlds**, a tool for seeing beyond, for perceiving the subtle web that connects matter, space and spirit.

For the 2025 edition of Design Week, 5VIE is expanding its exhibition programme with an important innovation: in addition to the historic spaces of Palazzo Correnti (via Cesare Correnti 14) and SIAM (via Santa Marta 18), a special exhibition will be set up in the prestigious Cavallerizze in via Olona 4. This new space, full of charm, will host projects that combine tradition and innovation, consolidating 5VIE's role as a reference point for research and experimentation in design.

Misha Kahn

Abject: Inhabit the Poché

American designer Misha Kahn moves through his work like an explorer charting uncharted territory, favouring instinct over convention, fusing chaos and control. His practice is a collision of craft, technology and material improvisation, drawing on a wide and unruly range of influences from the exuberance of Niki de Saint Phalle to the fluidity of Verner Panton. Whether sculpting directly into the computer or building with a wide range of media, the end result is a new visual landscape. Kahn treats making as an open-ended conversation with his materials, and it seems they never get bored. Nothing is fixed, everything is negotiable. The outcome is a body of work that seems to have emerged from an alternate reality - one in which excess and spontaneity override logic and restraint.

This fluid, flowing approach extends into his furniture, where objects appear caught in midtransformation, their varied forms uncontainable. A couch might resemble a Haribo mix left in a hot car, a chair might feel like a conscious creature, and even the most industrial materials can take on an unexpected theatricality. Collaborations with renowned manufacturers prove that even within the constraints of serial production, Kahn's work refuses to be tamed, maintaining the raw energy of oneoff experiments while finding its place within the reproducible world of design.

Kahn's latest venture to launch at 5 VIE is Abject. Abject is a home and homeware brand emerging from his studio - taking his idiosyncratic material language into production. This first outing - Abject: Inhabit the Poché - reveals this bold new vision of domesticity, with the inaugural presentation focusing on movement as Abject takes shape in Milan. His signature IZK chairs - inspired by a traditional wooden chair design from an Isayaka in Japan - become both performers and set pieces in an animated



spectacle. Visitors enter a space draped in fabric, where the silhouettes of the chairs are in a constant state of flux, like a shadow puppet show. As the performance unfolds, the chairs come to life.

At the heart of it all is a refusal to let objects behave as we expect them to. Instead of existing as contrasting objects, they invite us into a parallel world. This version mirrors the contradictions of human experience - playful yet serious, absurd yet profound, messy yet meticulously crafted. Ultimately, Kahn builds an entire universe in which joy, disorder and creative audacity reign supreme. All together.

Colture Project OTHER SPACES

It is an experimental project that combines different professions, experiences and skills, following an anthropo-social and ecological approach. The production of unique pieces or limited-edition objects, functional and poetic, is the result of the encounter between conceptual processes and manual operations derived from practices from architecture, design, craftsmanship and contemporary art. OTHER SPACES is the title of the exhibition for Cavallerizze where Colture Project presents an environmental installation in which the latest recycling productions on the theme Other Spaces converge. Mental spaces, uninhabited islands and cosmic places coexist in everyday objects with a conceptual matrix. The objects of Colture Project's research eschew their exhibition function and inhabit the display as elements of an ever-changing landscape, in which the fruits of collaboration between human and natural energies find new forms of sustainable coexistence.

Julie & Jesse Metamorphism Curated by Annalisa Rosso Produced by 5VIE 5VIE Headquarters, Cavallerizze, Via Olona 4

Ceramics are among the most ancient and universal expressions of human creativity, an elemental gesture of transformation- earth, water, fire - resulting in a material that is both resilient and fragile. In their body of work, presented in part in a pyramidal display that recalls both archetypal ritual architectures and contemporary modular structures, Julie & Jesse explore the boundaries of this material, stretching its possibilities and working in a state of constant equilibrium.

Based in Hong Kong, the duo operates within a unique crossroads of influences, balancing Eastern and Western traditions while merging heritage with contemporary languages. Their experimental approach resists categorization, stretching across the fields of design, craft, and art, moving seamlessly between functional objects and pure artistic expression. Their backgrounds reflect this intersection: Swiss designer Julie Progin and American artist Jesse Mc Lin bring distinct perspectives that converge in a shared language of forms. A new universal language, emerging from an ancient alphabet that everybody knows by heart.

This interplay of contrasts emerges in every gesture. Porcelain, a material known for its unforgiving nature - demanding precision, allowing little room for error - is approached with a sense of discovery, pushing the limits of balance and structure. It is precisely this continuous redefinition of equilibrium that makes their pieces feel both familiar, rooted in an ancestral knowledge, and entirely unexpected. They are objects never seen before, not only in their aesthetic qualities but also in their technical achievements, which extend beyond conventional limits of ceramic production. An intrinsic tension, as if caught between stillness and motion, echoing broader questions of shifting identities.



The pyramidal structure conceived for the exhibition at Cavallerizze is not a neutral display. It reinforces this sense of layered meaning. An architecture of ascent, a movement from foundation to peak, but also an invitation to deconstruct hierarchies of perception. More than a singular narrative, it offers a constellation of possibilities, much like the hybrid nature of their practice itself - moving between continuity and reinvention.

Prendete & Mangiate

Divine Decadence

Divine Decadence is a bold exploration of opulence, sensuality and playful provocation. Comprising an art de la table collection of vases, vessels and reversible bowls, these sculptural creations are crafted



from marble, some adorned with stainless steel spikes and others left plain. Inside each spike are delicate handmade jasmine flowers in double silk organza, symbolising splendour.

Each object features removable, sculpted mother-of-pearl rods, designed to slide discreetly within the form. Together, they take the form of a fruit, "the fruit of sin", an ode to temptation. While exuding elegance and luxury, these rods hide a daring twist that subtly mimics intimate toys, seamlessly blending functionality and eroticism in an unapologetic celebration of desire.

Designed to provoke thought and spark conversation, the collection celebrates the harmonious fusion of art and fetish. Rooted in the theme of enlightenment, it unveils the shadows of human desire and taboo, revealing what is often hidden and embracing a bold dialogue of personal expression with a subtle nod to the forbidden.

Through Divine Decadence, the contrast between the timeless purity of marble, the shimmering effect of mother-of-pearl, the aggressive presence of spikes and the sensual fragility of jasmine invites the viewer to experience a visual tension intertwined with tactile audacity. It encourages them to revel in the pleasure of the unexpected, to find splendour in the unconventional and to embrace the divine in the decadent, leading to a celebration of the bold, the daring and the enlightened.

Suspension and becoming, *The Chrysalis Knows The River's Song* captures the fragile tension between seemingly motionless retreat and profound transformation. Inspired by the silent moment and poetic effort before flight, the installation invites the body to listen, to move, to become part of the metamorphosis.

'What for the caterpillar is the end of the world, the world calls a butterfly'.

From the Greek chrysos -oro- the chrysalis is a threshold of change, vibrant with the promise of flight. It looks like a silken cocoon and yet within it is the flow of a life that pushes to be reborn, a gestation that contains the flow of life. Like a river in its perpetual motion, it makes its song heard in the constant going and then rejoins the sea. People will be able to stand inside this sound hourglass, a bath of evolutionary aquatic sound. In this golden suspension, we prepare to fly. The Flat-Massimo Carasi gallery is pleased to collaborate with 5VIE presenting the works of the Iranian artist Hiva Alizadeh (1989, Kerman, Iran) in via Cesare Correnti 14. The combination of tradition and contemporary aesthetics creates a world of visual and emotional contrasts, above all thanks to the materials used to deconstruct the millenary concept of the Persian carpet: through the use of coloured synthetic hair, the artist gives substance to a stratification of pictorial veils that reveal themselves to the spectator when interacting with the work.

Always striving to bring painting and sculpture together in a single body, Hiva works with suspension and weightlessness, creating visual and tactile vibrations.

The viewer will find impalpable blades of fire rising above fluid vertical masses of water: the greatest contrast known to man, the most disruptive yet vital forces, two opposites meeting to create harmony: water and fire.

Alizadeh's works can be found in public and private collections throughout Europe, the Middle East, China and the United States, including important institutions and foundations such as AKZONOBEL Art Foundation - Amsterdam, The Netherlands. Colours associated with 6 different types of love, from Eros, the passionate form of love, to Ludus, Storge, Mania, Pragma and finally Agape, the selfless form of love.

Bar Altra Vista

On the occasion of the annual Milan Design Week, Anotherview is proud to present 'Bar Altra Vista' at the Cavallerizze, located in the 5VIE district. Bar Altra Vista, conceived as a natural extension of Trattoria Altra Vista, extends the pilot project presented last year in the spaces of Palazzo Litta, enhancing its communicative and experiential capabilities. The next editions of the project, planned for New York and then Dubai, will see Bar Altra Vista at the centre of daytime activities: not only a bar, but also a space dedicated to talks, presentations and cultural meetings, maintaining a welcoming and convivial atmosphere. At the same time, Bar Altra Vista will be an installation of refined Italian design.

Upon entering Bar Altra Vista, you are greeted by the typical atmosphere of an Italian bar, where ordering a spritz is a ritual, endless games take place around a finely crafted Hermelin pool table and lively conversation fills the air. Music creates the perfect ambience to savour a slice of the Italian lifestyle - authentic yet refined - while enjoying drinks and delicious food in the dynamic buzz of Milan Design Week. This is a place that weaves together countless stories, a space where memories are shared, familiar yet elevated by contemporary and sophisticated design. The result of the vision of a team of Italian designers and artists, including Anotherview, Andrea Mancuso of Analogia Project, Duilio Forte, Simone Fanciullacci, Matteo Di Ciommo, Benedetta Mori Ubaldini, Andrea Zambelli, Constantino Gucci and Tonino Negri, Bar Altra Vista is a unique and unusual immersive experience. Not just an installation, but a place where several events will take place: among others, Studio F will present a preview of two pieces from their first collection, designed by Simone Fanciulacci; the walls of the bar will display some works from Duilio Forte's project 'Lupus in Fabula'; a refreshment area, created in collaboration with street artist Sorte, will be entrusted to chef Aldo Ritrovato of Stadera Milano; and Anotherview will present 'Memory of a Travel', an exclusive project created for the British luggage company Globe-Trotter.

For this year's exhibition project, the Anotherview team has collaborated with the artist and architect Duilio Forte, who has re-imagined the space inside Cavallerizze as the stylised belly of a whale: a structure made of wooden beams that creates a space within a space, creating a more intimate and convivial atmosphere without obscuring the original charm and grandeur of the setting. This stylised structure makes it possible to "decorate" imaginary walls with photographs and shared memories of life's journey; an invisible ceiling from which are suspended luminous bodies designed by the Spanish design duo Mayice Studio, responsible for the lighting design of the installation. Bar Altra Vista is a meeting point between tradition and innovation, offering the public a unique experience that celebrates design, art, gastronomy and the conviviality that characterises our country.

ELIURPI's proposal observes the permanent flow of nature in the Mediterranean as the stage on which we must immerse ourselves and embrace the unique logos in which our existence is fused.

Everything is a reflection of this unity in which everything flows. The essence of life is change, we must force ourselves to discover that everything and all things flow, nothing remains. In this installation, the essence of order is constant change. Change towards the natural, towards light and shadow. A light installation that manifests the constant movement of life. Eliurpi presents a collection of light sculptures that represent this change towards the natural, inspired by the Mediterranean seaweed that needs light to live. A light that they want to show both from the inside of the sculptures and from the outside.

FMM Design

Plinio: The eruption of Vesuvius in art

FMM Design, a studio specialising in collectible design, will participate in 5VIE Design Week with a collection inspired by natural phenomena, in particular the eruption of Vesuvius in 79 AD. For the occasion, a new edition of the Plinio table and two new lamps, born from the same material and conceptual research, will be presented.

The collection explores the transformative power of nature, capturing the primordial energy of eruption in works that fuse sculpture and functionality. The Plinio table, made of natural basalt, symbolises the strength and geological memory of the volcano, while the black glass top evokes solidified lava. The Plinio lamps, on the other hand, reinterpret the drama of the eruptive event through a lava stone base and a resin and cement cloud treated with volcanic ash, creating an evocative and immersive illumination.

Each piece is a unique work that transforms the destructive force of Vesuvius into an object of refined artistic expression, suspended between historical memory and material innovation.

Glass & Glass Nothing New to Invent

"Nothing new to invent" is the title of the event to be held during Milan Design Week 2025, an exhibition dedicated to the "I Tondi" chandelier designed by Carlo Nason in collaboration with the international design studio S20M.

The event is a tribute to Carlo Nason, a "successful unknown" who worked from the 1960s to the end of the 1990s, creating extraordinary glass chandeliers that combine the centuries-old knowledge of the Murano glass masters with the industrial production of the period.

This project is the result of a long collaboration with Nason and the reworking of unpublished designs that have remained in the maestro's drawer for years. The 'I Tondi' chandeliers, produced by Glass & Glass, are characterised by their elegant simplicity, inspired by the circular modular shape of the glass panels that make them up, combining aesthetics and innovation in a refined reinterpretation of glass design.

In the splendid setting of Cavallerizze, the limited edition 'I Tondi' column, specially designed for the occasion by S20M, will be exhibited, a unique piece that celebrates the dialogue between the past and the future of glass design.

Each item is signed by Ivan Baj and dated 2025.

Jean Yves Lanvin Mineral Sculpture

Between art and design, Jean Yves Lanvin creates his works with a vision in which he expresses clean, asymmetrical lines with great attention to materials and their finishing. For 5VIE, he presents two of his iconic creations, the "Block Sculpture" table and the "Block Sculpture" console, the expression of an intense art form to experiment with.

Jonathan Bocca Bicefalo

5VIE Headquarters, Cavallerizze, Via Olona 4

Jonathan Bocca (1998) is a sculptor and designer from Lucca, Tuscany. He graduated in Interior and Furniture Design from IED Florence and had the opportunity to experiment at the Fabrica Research Center in Treviso, where he studied and worked with new materials for his sculptures and objects. His work focuses on the use of recycled paper, a material produced from waste from the main industries in his hometown, Lucca. After processing it for a few days, it becomes an extremely durable, almost entirely organic compound that is easy to manage. Jonathan aims to raise awareness about the use of organic waste recycling in our daily lives. He believes that design should not use non-recyclable materials and seeks to spread the possibility of changing the way design is conceived, starting with low-cost and recycled materials, reinterpreting them, and giving them new life and meaning. His objects are inspired by dreams, transformed into reality through the creation of dreamlike creatures.

LEGADO ARTESANO CASTILLA-LA MANCHA MUD TRAPPING

The exhibition showcases contemporary craftsmanship, featuring the techniques and artisans from Castilla-La Mancha. This project is inclusive and collaborative, bringing together both male and female craftsmen in a unified installation. A ceramic sculpture, crafted from over 1550 pieces of clay and enamel by the collective of Castilla-La Mancha, symbolizes the bond within the pottery and ceramics community of the region.

Heart of Glass

This design approach aims for a result that feels almost instinctive and organic, connecting more closely to the earth, humanity, and our shared history.

Maygo Studio Crafting Connections

"Crafting Connections" is a project based on the combination of rich traditional textile practices from Poland, which aims at preserving the country's cultural heritage while simultaneously promoting its sustainable development. The project brings into dialogue elements of the traditional Polish culture from the Podlaski region with contemporary art and design, promoting a playful and sustainable way of preserving cultural heritage as a key aspect of a revitalized and culturally vibrant future, connected with one's roots and childhood memories. "Crafting Connections" is a bond between the past and the future, a language through which designer Małgorzata Truszkowska tells the culture of her region, which is disappearing with the tumultuous arrival of modernity.

Michael Milesi - Millesimi Design HEA Lamp

The HEA Lamp, designed by Michael Milesi of Millesimi Design, transforms the H-profile metal beam into a luminous marble icon. Light passes through the fragmented structure, creating a striking balance between the solidity of the stone and the lightness of the luminous beams. Each piece combines craftsmanship and innovation, becoming a timeless work of Italian design.

Moei Clubhouse

The Clubhouse Collection by Moei, unveiled during Milan Design Week at the prestigious 5VIE Art + Design, draws inspiration from the vibrant energy of Pop Art, the freedom of Postmodernism, and the forward-thinking design innovations of Rotterdam. This fusion gives life to playful pieces that transcend the boundaries of sensory design, appealing to those in search of a fresh twist. "Clubhouse" represents a meeting point for individuals in constant evolution, a space where creative minds connect. Comprising 15 unique pieces, this inaugural collection reflects the limitless potential of artistic expression and design experimentation, visible in the works of Jeff Koons, Roni Horn, and Gaetano Pesce. Made from steel, resin, ceramics, and glass, each piece embodies a balance between technical innovation and art. Emerging from a dialogue between storytelling and utility, the collection's 10 designs articulate a meeting point of material, connection, memory and technique. This milestone release marks Studio KO's 25th anniversary and the debut of Beni's most ambitious and complex rug constructions to date, featuring five weaving methods including the introduction of Rabat, a sophisticated reinterpretation of



the intricate R'bati carpet: a hyper-fine point knotted style that was born in Morocco's capital city over 500 years ago that has remained unchanged until now.

Cecilia Pantaleo STUDI

STUDI is the result of years of research by interior designer Cecilia Pantaleo. The project took root when she discovered that by rethinking lampshades she could create lighting inspired by stylised architectural forms. For this installation, the latest Capsule Collection has been selected, entirely handcrafted by master artisans. Metals, irregular surfaces, oxidized patinas. Mirrors, light. Textured fabrics, soft upholstery. The only color: sand white. Mirage is an oasis, a refuge away from the noise of time, an echo of imaginary places and ancestral reminiscences.

The collection embodies FLAIR's aesthetic—a delicate balance between artisanal craftsmanship and design intuition. Irregular surfaces, geometries and unexpected details, material presence. And a sense of transformation, of something in motion, like sand shaping the dunes. Mirage celebrates the authenticity of imperfection, where beauty emerges through subtraction.

With Mirage, FLAIR reaffirms its vision, strengthened by a nomadic spirit. Luxury lies in the invitation to lose oneself between reality and illusion, to rediscover the deeper meaning of living, to create worlds as works of art. A design that does not chase time but shapes it. A perspective, a precise cut, a signature.

HOUSE OF ITA Moving

Margarita (Ita) Aleksievska Sclavi, known as "House of Ita," is a multimedia textile artist of Macedonian origin, now based in Rome.

She creates tapestries by reworking antique fabrics and tapestries, introducing a new language through mixed techniques (painting, embroidery, collage...) and designs limited-edition artistic textiles for the



home. Her work explores symbolic archetypes and iconographies of Balkan origin, infused with Byzantine and medieval memories, expressed through unique and deeply personal marks.

What sets her work apart is the careful fusion of traditional and contemporary elements, playing with unions and contrasts. Ita gives life to a delicately mysterious iconography, imbued with a sense of unreality and surprise.

Her creations are the result of a meeting between East and West: a visual poetry, a narrative, and a reflection of her imaginary world.

Iyo Hasegawa ANGLE

5VIE Headquarters, Via Cesare Correnti 14

The work ANGLE features geometric instruments such as a protractor, a triangular ruler and a straightedge, all centred around the theme of the joy of changing angles and shapes. As the angle indicated by the protractor changes, the triangular ruler and straightedge come together in different configurations, transforming both the form and function of the tools. This adaptable combination results in a design that is both dynamic and textured. Made of transparent and lightweight acrylic plastic, the connections between the parts reinforce the geometric harmony, creating a suggestive space with a beautiful floating effect. This exhibition presents furniture that embodies this concept.

Johnny Li CONVIVIUM

5VIE Headquarters, Via Cesare Correnti 14

For Milan Design Week 2025, architect and designer Johnny Li unveils CONVIVIUM - a striking installation that distils the essence of gathering into form. Part of his YILINE collection, the showcase revolves around CATHERINE, a contemporary reimagining of the traditional mahjong table - designed not just for play, but as a dynamic hub for modern living. Its triangular silhouette invites fluid interaction, reconfiguring the social geometry of games while embracing the rituals of shared space. Surrounding it, four TETSU chairs balance sculptural precision with quiet strength, their sleek frames grounding the scene. Nearby, TAY offers a lesson in adaptability - at once a stool and a side table, it moves effortlessly between function and spontaneity. Completing the ensemble, TYLER introduces a playful rhythm, its refined rocking form adding a sense of movement to the composition. Li's installation is more than furniture - made in Italy from reclaimed wood by Studio F, it is an exploration of connection, where materiality, movement and memory come together in a celebration of contemporary life.

Mani Studio

Terre e Trame: a radical dialogue between ceramics and knitwear

5VIE Headquarters, Via Cesare Correnti 14

Terre e Trame is a project that explores the material tension between the solidity of ceramics and the flexibility of knitwear, redefining the boundary between craftsmanship and contemporary design. In this novel encounter, traditional ceramics are reinvented through colour, glazes and manual manipulation, while knitwear is transformed into a sculptural and architectural structure, expanding its expressive possibilities.

Massimiliano Pipolo DANS LA SALLE DE BAIN

Cloches, domes and glass bells are instruments of display and celebration. Traditionally, they housed objects that symbolised memories, such as the cloches des mariées, which protected and displayed the crowns of young brides, evoking memories of joyous occasions. In their glass bell form, Les Cache



Choses become opaque representations of hidden memories - intimate and profound. These pieces invite us to reconnect with an inner world full of light, shadows, memories, dreams and moments that, although in the past, remain cherished in the sanctity of our inner selves.

DANS LA SALLE DE BAIN, an installation for Milan Design Week 2025, presents a selection of Cache Choses, translating their message of intimacy into a design language that reflects our deep 'jardin secret'. Accompanied by a collection of iconic objects such as mirrors, sconces and cloches, they evoke memories of our inner selves and the private worlds we inhabit.

Monography by Bruno Zampa Romanzo Razionale - Debonademeo Studio

Created by on.entropy, the marble atelier founded by Greek duo Niki and Zoe Moskofoglou, in collaboration with the Art Rug Project led by Electra Soutzouglou, the collection is inspired by the organic shapes and functional beauty of mushrooms.

At the heart of the collection is a velvety sculptural rug, marking the studio's first foray into textiles. This piece reflects the creators' shared love of innovative techniques, textures and finishes, stemming from their deep family ties to traditional craftsmanship. The rich textures and fluid shapes of the rug are beautifully complemented by on.entropy's sculptural marble lighting and furniture. These pieces strike a balance between sensual form and unexpected lightness, transforming marble into fluid, jewel-like elements within a space.

With an emphasis on sensory exploration, Holy Luci celebrates texture, light, plasticity and the harmonious interplay of materials, inviting a fresh dialogue between marble and textiles.

Pietrachiara Nouveau Réalisme

Pietrachiara returns to the 5VIE district with its iconic Anne columns, first presented here two years ago. Crafted from solid linden wood with hand-finished carvings, they exemplify Italian artisanal mastery. They are now reintroduced in a contemporary version, featuring an ultra-pigmented finish inspired by Yves Klein blue, which curiously complements the details of the magnificent ancient palazzo on Via Cesare Correnti 14. As in Nouveau Réalisme, the elements come together based on their 'collective singularity,' standing together despite, or because of, their differences. A message that today, more than ever, we want to emphasize.

Chiaroscuro: A Light in the Darkness

Within the installation, new glass works engage in a dance of light and colour inspired by the extraordinary ordinary moments that inspire awe and ignite us, from the vastness of the sky reflected in a drop of water, to the feel of a child's hand in your own, or a community coming together in joyful defiance of those who would divide us. Chiaroscuro is an invitation to celebrate each act of light and kindness, no matter how small, for cumulatively these acts have the potential to add up to something bigger and more powerful than we can even imagine.

Sagarminaga Atelier Tuna Ex Machina

Sagarminaga Atelier presents Tuna Ex Machina at 5VIE Design Week 2025: a kinetic sculpture that combines craftsmanship, movement and technology. Inspired by the Atlantic bluefin tuna, this work challenges the boundary between the natural and the mechanical, reinventing design as a living system in constant evolution.

Sagarminaga Atelier presents a work that redefines the intersection of craftsmanship, movement and materiality at 5VIE Milan Design Week. Inspired by the Atlantic bluefin tuna, this kinetic sculpture transcends static representation by fusing plant fibres with metal to create an articulated form that mimics the beat of the ocean. Through the fusion of ancestral craftsmanship and kinetic design, Tuna Ex Machina is more than a sculpture; it is a system in constant evolution, a piece that embraces the paradigm of immersive and participatory design. It represents the delicate balance between tradition and progress, reminding us that movement is not just survival, but a narrative in transformation.

At the heart of the exhibition lies HEECH (Persian for "Nothingness"), a profound philosophy rooted in Persian Sufism. It embraces the idea that creation springs from nothingness, which permeates the universe and resides within all of us. To surrender to this emptiness is to dissolve the ego and discover wisdom, beauty, and unity. Lila Valadan's Aleph Collection embodies this ethos, blending the raw poetry of nature with a reverence for tradition and craftsmanship. As the leading female rug artist from Iran, a nine-time Carpet Design Award winner, and an AD 100 nominee, Valadan's work bridges past and future, carrying the belief that tradition is not about preserving ashes but keeping the fire alive. Crafting a Lila Valadan rug is akin to a silent prayer a meditative dance of the hands. It is an art both ancient and perpetually youthful, telling stories of Persia's gentle hills and vast deserts. Textures form like constellations in a starlit sky, born from distant dreams and familiar landscapes. The colours - extracted from pomegranate peels, saffron, and walnut shells - are more than pigments; they are the living essence of the land, infused with sun, sand, and the earth's vitality. Her rugs do not merely come into existence - they grow, thread by thread, like a tree shaped by time, spirit, and intention. HEECH offers a raw, unfiltered perspective on design, stripping away the noise of superficial trends to reveal a language shaped by materiality, organic movement, and the timeless energy of human hands. Rooted in Sufi philosophy, the exhibition explores the poetic interplay of emptiness, light, and shadow - symbols of the void essential for encountering the divine. This minimalist yet profound approach embodies a spiritual ideology of shedding ego and worldly desires to uncover truth, unity, and inner peace. It invites those attuned to the subtle art of listening to connect with creations infused with history, spirit, and authentic meaning.

Ammannati and Vitelli 1955-2025, 70 years of architecture and design LIVING THE SPACE

The luminaires feature a light, rounded sunburst shape, casting a warm glow that animates the portico and creates luminous pathways. Flower-shaped lighting elements form a captivating interplay of light and shadow in the garden, nestled between the columns and foliage. Inside the sacristy, a straight path is defined by two parallel rows of flower-shaped floor lamps. The installation includes twenty-four lamps with thirty-two rays in the cloister, sixteen in the garden, and eight in the sacristy; this deliberate use of the number eight and its multiples pays homage to Bramante, who similarly incorporated this number in his design, alongside the twelve apostles and four evangelists.

LUCE TU KOMOREBI - Luce tra le foglie

The installation LUCE TU embodies and conveys the Japanese philosophy of Komorebi, an evocative and highly relevant term that depicts the image of light filtering through the leaves of trees. This natural phenomenon expresses the beauty of impermanence and fosters a deep connection with the present, celebrating the harmonious relationship with nature and living in the here and now.

LUCE TU aims to bring the concept of Komorebi into everyday environments, developing the project across two complementary dimensions. On one side, the focus is on analyzing sunlight to recreate its delicate natural effect; on the other, a structure made of symbolic leaves is designed using cold metal casting techniques.

This approach creates a refined interplay of shadows, light reflections, and warm metallic hues on the gold and copper-colored leaves, offering a constant alternation of vibrant shades.

In this dynamic, the shadows cast by the leaves transform into sources of light, amplified by warmth, giving life to an immersive experience that invites the observer to pause in the present moment and capture its magic.

The work is signed by architect Isacco Brioschi, creative director of LUCE TU, who orchestrated this sensory journey within a conceptual zen garden, created with natural materials such as sand, wood, and stone.
